Why did people move west?

A. Seeking Opportunity in the West

- 1. Before Civil War the "West" was the Mississippi River Region.
- 2. Reasons to "move west"
 - a. a new start in life
 - b. fleeing prejudice—racial, religious, etc.
- 3. Most western lands belonged to "Big Business"
 - a. railroads given land by the federal government– land sold to pay for railroad building
 - 4. Morrill Land-Grant Act of 1862
 - a. gave 140 million acres of land to western state governments

- b. land then sold through speculators
- 5. 1862 Homestead Act
 - federal government sold land directly to settlers
 - b. 160 acres for \$10 fee and "improving" land for 5 years

1900: individuals owned 80 million acres business owned 500 million acres

- B. Opportunity for African-Americans
 - 1. "exodusters" -- settlers
 - 2. often not successful -- WHY?
 - a. little money
 - b. racism
 - 3. lack of crop knowledge
- C. Cooperation in the West
 - 1. Settlers relied on each other WHY?

- a. requirement of manual labor
- b. need for self-sufficiency
- 2. At first, had to make own necessities
- 3. Men took off-season jobs
- D. Women in the West
 - Could file own homestead claim However, still had to fulfill the 5 year improvement requirement
 - 2. Women became more independent suffrage
 - 3. 1914 11 states allowed women to vote.
